GOMBE STATE UNIVERSITY MANAGEMENT DISTRIBUTES RAMADAN PALLIATIVES TO JUNIOR STAFF

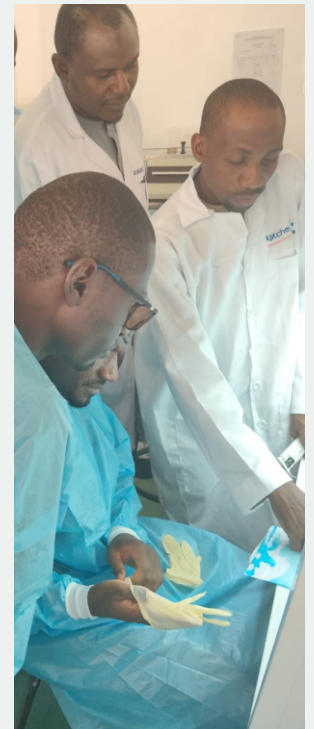
lecture, particularly during the holy month of Ramadan.

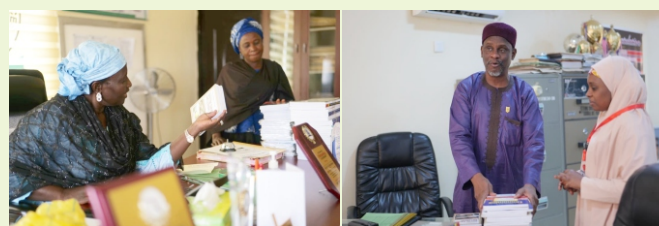
